This email group is dedicated to getting information to people with disabilities (and supporters) in Linn County, Iowa (including Cedar Rapids, Marion, Hiawatha), and occasionally surrounding counties. This is a moderated listserv. It is “cross-disability” – open to people with all kinds of disabilities of all ages.

Postings can be about local events & happenings (workshops/trainings/conferences and social events), new services, and advocacy opportunities. Questions (related to local disability issues) are welcomed.

Topics can include housing, transportation, health, SSI/SSDI, Medicare/Medicaid (“Title 19”), employment, independent living, self-advocacy, peer support & empowerment activities, assistive technology, education, CIL & VR services, ADA access (e.g.: accessibility within the community), transitional issues, etc. Occasionally, information will be provided on ACTION ALERTS from the state or federal levels related to disability issues.
